







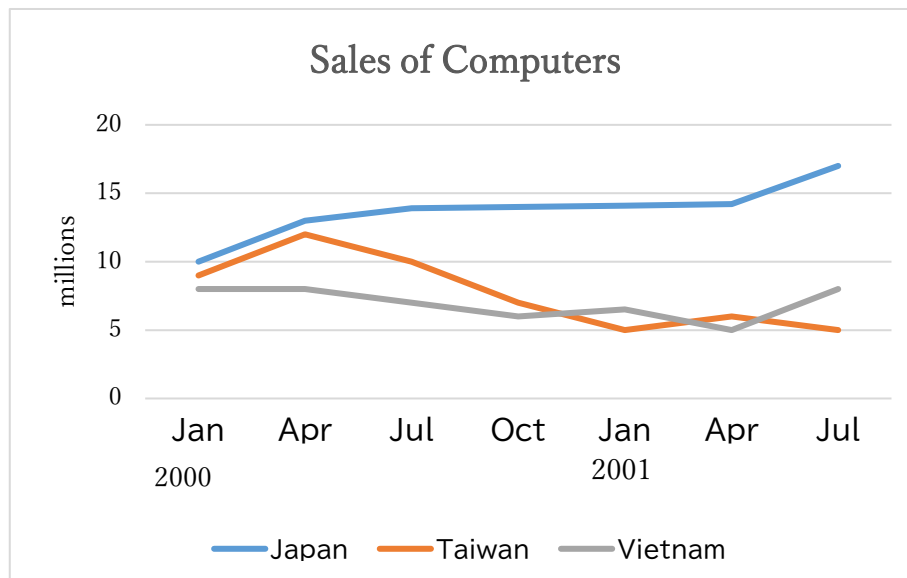

This graph shows sales of computers in three Asian countries, Japan, Taiwan and Vietnam, from January 2000 to July 2001. These three countries show different sales trends.

Sales of computers in Japan have been steadily increasing. (1) From April 2000 to April 2001, there was a gradual rise and then sales rose rapidly again to 17 million from April to July of 2001. To sum up, sales of computers in Japan show a constant rise during this entire period.

Next, let's look at Taiwan. In January 2000, sales were just under 9 million. The figure rose dramatically from 9 million in January to 12 million in April. In April it reached a peak and then dropped rapidly. It continued to drop until January 2001. (2)

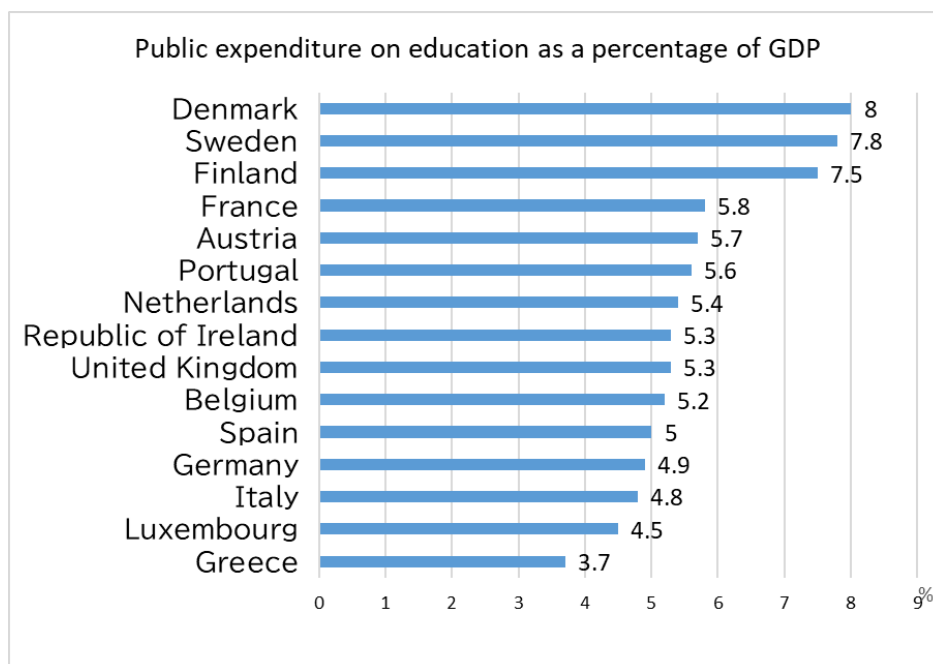
Now Vietnam. From January to April 2000, there was very little change, but then sales began to drop gradually and the trend continued until October. (3) In total, sales of computers in Vietnam dropped during 2000 but recovered by July 2001.

In conclusion, Taiwan has for the most part shown a constant drop in sales, while Japan has shown a steady rise. Sales in Vietnam dropped once, but began to rise again.

6. Refer to the graph and the following passage. Then, fill each space with the most appropriate option from A-D.



This graph shows public expenditure on education as a percentage of GDP of the EU countries. In terms of percentage of expenditure on education, these countries can be divided into (1) groups.

Denmark is the country in Europe which spends the most as a percentage of GDP on education, with 8%. Sweden and Finland follow Denmark with 7.8% and 7.5% respectively. These three countries form the first group in terms of expenditure on education.

After this (2) group, France, Austria, Portugal, the Netherlands, the Republic of Ireland, the United Kingdom, and Belgium follow. In this group, France spends the most with 5.8%. Belgium comes last with 5.2%. However, the gap between France and Belgium is only (3)%, so there is not much difference among these seven countries.

The third group consists of five countries: Spain, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg and Greece. The percentage for Spain is 5%, followed by 4.9% for Germany, 4.8% for Italy, and 4.5% for Luxembourg. Greece comes last of all, spending only 3.7% of its GDP on education.

This graph shows us that the countries in the north tend to spend (4) money on education while the percentage decreases towards the (5). Although the third group includes (6), which are not located in southern Europe, the general trend is for higher education expenditure in the north and (7) in the south.
