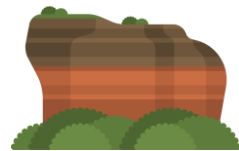

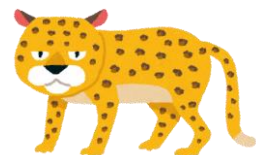

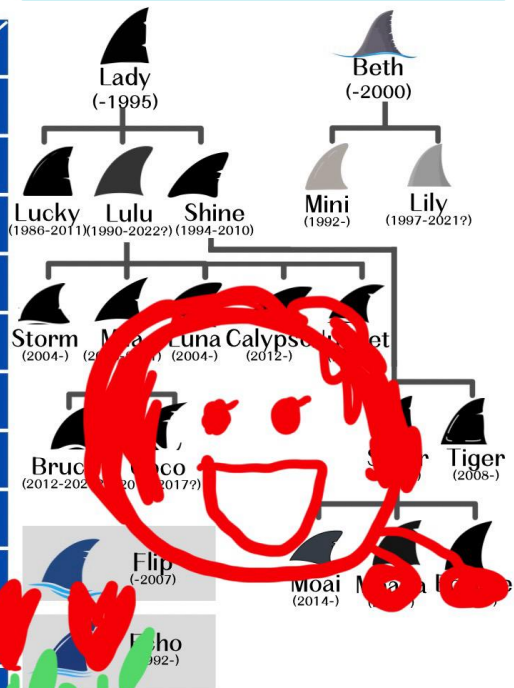

Dr. Tetsu Nakamura was a devoted Japanese physician renowned for his humanitarian work in Afghanistan and Pakistan. He strongly believed in helping others. This was captured by his favorite saying, "to light up a corner," which means to assist those nearby and spread happiness. After starting his medical career in Japan, Dr. Nakamura developed a love for the region when visiting mountainous areas in Afghanistan and Pakistan to see rare butterflies.

In 1984, while working in Pakistan to treat leprosy patients, Dr. Nakamura encountered many difficulties with broken medical tools and frequent power cuts, forcing him to conduct surgeries by flashlight. The war in Afghanistan brought many refugees into Pakistan, so Dr. Nakamura decided to open a clinic in Afghanistan.

Faced with severe drought in Afghanistan, many children fell ill from drinking dirty water. Understanding that clean water was essential, Dr. Nakamura began digging wells in 2000. Soon he realized that groundwater was depleting, and in 2003, he decided to build an irrigation canal. Lacking experience, he studied mathematics, borrowing textbooks from his high-school daughter to prepare for the task.

By 2010, Nakamura had completed the "Marwarid" canal, meaning "pearl" in the local language, which transformed the barren desert into fertile land. This allowed villagers to grow crops like wheat, oranges, and radishes. His ongoing efforts provided water and food for 650,000 people. The Afghan government honored him with special citizenship, recognizing his immense contribution. The projects were possible with support from Japan and collaboration with local Afghans and Japanese volunteers.

Many Afghans, previously soldiers out of necessity, became farmers, thanks to his canals, embodying his belief that "Peace has more power than war and requires more patience and effort."

The echidna is a fascinating and unique animal native to Australia and New Guinea. Also known as a spiny anteater, the echidna is one of the only mammals in the world that lays eggs, making it quite special. These creatures have long, sharp spines on their backs, much like a porcupine, which help protect them from predators. In addition to spines, their bodies are covered with coarse hair that serves as extra insulation.

Echidnas possess small eyes and a long, tube-like snout. This snout is a vital tool, helping them locate and consume food. Their tongue is particularly remarkable—extremely long and sticky, it is perfect for catching ants and termites, which make up the bulk of their diet. Unlike many other animals, echidnas do not have teeth, so they rely on their powerful tongues to gather and eat their food efficiently.

These animals are known for being very shy and prefer to live alone. In the wild, an echidna will typically curl up into a tight ball when it senses danger, using its spines as a formidable defense mechanism. This tactic makes it difficult for potential predators to harm or capture them.

When it comes to reproduction, mother echidnas lay eggs and keep them secure in a pouch on their belly. After about ten days, the egg hatches into a baby echidna, known as a puggle. The puggle stays in its mother's pouch for approximately two months. After this period, the mother moves the puggle to a burrow, where it continues to grow. The mother will feed and care for the puggle until it reaches about seven months old, ensuring it is ready to survive on its own.

Echidnas are highly adaptable creatures and can live in various environments, including forests, grasslands, and deserts. They are excellent diggers and often create burrows to sleep in during the daylight hours. Being nocturnal animals, echidnas prefer to venture out at night to search for food.

Echidnas play an important role in their ecosystem by helping control ant and termite populations. Their unique characteristics and behaviors make them a subject of great interest and wonder to scientists and animal lovers alike.
